

The school governing council is the major decision-making and fundraising body. Members are elected for a two-year period at the Annual Meeting in February. All parents are welcome to attend school council meetings or to submit items for the agenda. Only elected members can vote on issues but you will be encouraged to join the council once you become a member of the school community. The governing council has many responsibilities including:

- advice to principal about curriculum and school policy matters
- involvement in the preparation of the annual “statement of purpose” document or Site Learning Plan
- approval of the annual budget
- ratification of decisions taken by other groups or sub-committees
- oversight of school facilities including buildings and grounds
- safe maintenance of playground equipment
- co-ordination of school fundraising
