## Expected Behaviour and Consequences for Unacceptable Behaviour at Lenswood Primary School 2014

Teachers work with students to help them understand that respecting themselves and others, their own property and others, the school and environment means that they will behave with courtesy, consideration and kindness towards others. Acting respectfully means that they will not swear or use inappropriate language and gestures, harass or bully others and they will behave with care and honesty towards their own and other's belongings. They will also take care of the school and look after their classrooms, the building and its grounds.

However, in order to clarify what happens in the case of inappropriate behaviour we have summarised the consequences that will be applied if students do not respect the norms of good behaviour expected at Lenswood School. These norms will be discussed with all classes and displayed in all areas and be placed in student diaries.

NB:-If a student is suspended from school this will result in exclusion from Sporting events, camps and other excursions in that term.
