

School Rules

At the beginning of the year, all classes discuss rules appropriate to their own classrooms. We emphasise respect for self and others, the school buildings and resources and their own belongings. We ask children to take responsibility for their behaviour and actions. We expect students to follow instructions or directions given by staff without argument or delay.

If students cannot follow instructions or play or work safely they will be excluded from the classroom or playground.

We expect all students to speak and behave in a courteous and considerate way to everyone they come in contact with.

Parents will be informed when their child has not followed school rules either by a note in their diary, by a phone call or by the teacher talking directly to the parent before or after school.



Student Representative Council (SRC)

All students are members of the SRC or Student Representative Council. They discuss issues relevant to student matters. The SRC will organise fundraising and special events. A rotating executive is appointed each week, consisting of chairperson, secretary, treasurer and observer.

Swimming and Sporting Events

We hold our own School Sports Day and there is keen competition between the Warriors and the Strikers but the emphasis of the day is on sportsmanship and participation. The school also encourages participation in SAPSASA (South Australian Primary School Amateur Sports Association) and this enables students aged 10 and up to participate in a range of interschool sporting competitions including netball, football, cricket, swimming, athletics and cross-country.

Swimming lessons are held in February each year at the Woodside Swimming Pool. This instruction is provided free by The Department for Education, but parents have to pay travel and pool entry costs. Ten x 45 minute lessons are provided to children in years 3-7 and five for R-2.
